

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

According to the 2011 American Community Survey, there are more than 110,000 South Asian Americans (SAA) living in the State of Maryland. That is one third of the total Asian American population of the state. It is estimated that the SAA community will continue to grow at a fast pace in Maryland in years to come. Governor O'Malley sought to give a bigger and louder voice to the South Asian Community, which is why he signed an executive order creating the South Asian Commission on August 29. 2012.

Although this Commission was not fully formed until August 2012, the Chair and members of the Commission had a full and eventful year. Members attended the Asian American Business Conference, helped organize the New Americans Street Festival, and attended the Joint Commission and Community Partners Assembly.

The Governor's Commission on South Asian American Affairs looks forward to serving the community and furthering the economic, educational, health, political and social well being of the South Asian American community of Maryland.

EVENTS

BAISAKHI CELEBRATION

Baisakhi is an extremely important celebration for the Sikh population in Maryland. It is combination of harvest festival, New Year, and religious holiday. The Governor hosted this celebration at the Government House for the second year in a row. This year's Baisakhi celebration was attended by the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) Delegation, which is the oldest and largest business organization that Governor O'Malley signed an MOU with his India trade mission. The FICCI Delegation was in Maryland to establish partnerships in biotechnology, renewable energy and infrastructure. The event was attended by the Lt. Governor, Paul Monteiro from the White House, Delegate Aruna Miller, Delegate Sam Arora and over 200 guests.

At the Baisakhi celebration, the Governor O'Malley took the opportunity to announce plans to form a South Asian American Commission.

THE NEW COMMISSION

Prior to the establishment of the South Asian Commission, there were several South Asian Commissioners on the Asian Pacific American Commission. When the Governor went on the 2011 trade mission in India, he decided that the South Asian Community needed their own voice in State government. His signature trip to India resulted in Executive Order No. 01.01.2012.17.A, creating the South Asian American Commission on August 29, 2012.

The Commission is made up of twenty-one Commissioners from all over the State of Maryland with varying ethnic, age, gender, and occupational background. The Commission advises the Governor on the issues in the South Asian Community regarding health, education, business development and community development. We will work to strengthen our communities by identifying and addressing their needs and concerns.

ASIAN AMERICAN BUSINESS CONFERENCE

Over 350 business people from all parts of the State participated in the May 21-22nd Asian American Business Conference (AABC). The conference, which featured seminars on state, federal and non-profit business resources, officially started on the evening of May 21, 2012 with a networking dinner. The dinner was designed to build on the Governor's 2011 Asia trade missions to China, India, Korea and Vietnam. Embassy officials from those countries attended, providing an opportunity for Maryland's small and midsized companies to further build export connections abroad.

The AABC is the only Asian American business conference in Maryland. Its main goal is to promote and support Asian American businesses by offering seminars and a trade show. This year's AABC has been completely reworked from the AABC of the years past. This year the AABC had eight workshops running on two tracks, a new website, and a new way of getting the attendees to engage the exhibitors. This year's AABC is by far the largest and most successful AABC since its inception.

Featured speakers at the conference included: Dominick E. Murray, Deputy Secretary of the Maryland Department of Business and Economic Development; Linda L. Chang, Senior Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of PharmAthene; Zenita Wickham Hurley, Special Secretary of the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs; Congressman John Sarbanes; and Dr. Ashok K. Thareja, CEO and President of A&T Systems.

Over 30 sponsors supported the conference, including Maryland Department of Business and Economic Development, Maryland Department of Labor Licensing and Regulations, Bank of America, Montgomery County Department of Economic Development, State Farm, Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development, ARINC and Lockheed Martin.

The planning committee was largely composed of members of the Maryland Governor's Commission on Asian American Affairs and various leaders and key organizations from the business and civic-oriented Asian-Pacific community in Maryland, including the Foundation for the Asian Pacific American Chamber of Commerce. Under Governor O'Malley's leadership, the State of Maryland has an unwavering commitment to ensure the prosperity and further expansion of all Maryland-based companies, with a special focus on minority, women-owned, and disadvantaged enterprises.

SIKH CANDLELIGHT PRAYER CEREMONY

After the tragedy of the Wisconsin Sikh temple shooting on August 5, 20012, lawmakers, politicians, police officials and religious leaders from all over Maryland attended various vigils around the State to mourn the loss of the Sikh community.

The Governor attended the Sikh Association of Baltimore vigil on Thursday August 9th, and gave the following remarks: "As we come together in the wake of unthinkable tragedy, and unimaginable heartache, it is humbling to think that this very gathering is a testament to our collective strength as a people. We come together today from many diverse backgrounds, from all walks of life, to stand with our friends in Wisconsin and throughout the Sikh community, shoulder to shoulder in solidarity.

Because in our great State, where our diversity is our greatest strength, we choose to be bound together by the common thread of human dignity.

While we may never truly be able to understand such senseless violence, we are left instead with a renewed resolve to stand up to hate in all its forms, ... to remember the victims, and refuse to go on as if nothing happened.

We are reminded today of the words of the first Guru, "In the whole wide world that I see around, nothing can be gained without good actions."

Although nothing we can do will ever ease this pain we feel, we will remember those who were lost through our own service to others. And we will honor them through our own efforts to stand up to evil throughout our world."

THE GOVERNOR'S JOINT COMMISSION AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS ASSEMBLY


